Exercise 1: This exercise encompasses a lot of half step intervals while moving down the fretboard on two strings finally landing on the octave.

B \flat **Chromatic:** B \flat – B – F - G \flat - C - D \flat - D - A \flat - A - E \flat - E - B \flat - B / B – B \flat – E – E \flat – A – A \flat – D – D \flat – G – G \flat – C – B



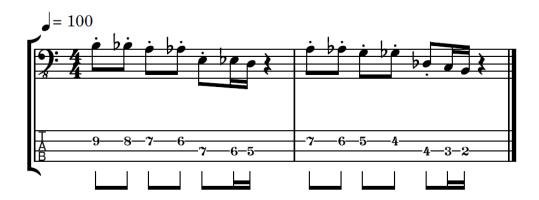


D# **Chromatic:** D# – E – A# – B – F – F# – C – C# – G – G# – D – D# / D# – D – G# – G – C# – C – F# – F – B – A# – E – D#

F# Chromatic: F# - F - E - D# - B - A# - A - E - D# - D - C# - G# - G - F#



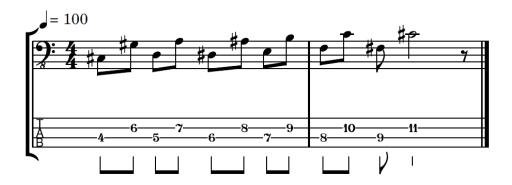

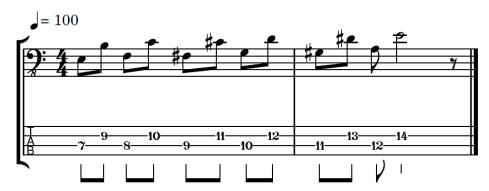
Exercise 3: Perfect 5th Chromatic Progression

E Chromatic: E - B - F - C - F#/Gb - C#/Db - G - D - G#/Ab - D#/Eb - A - E



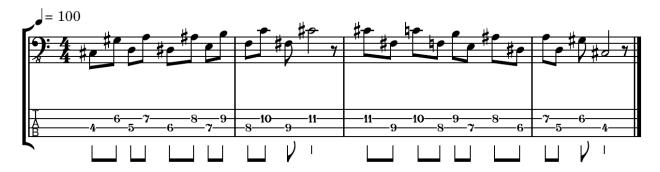

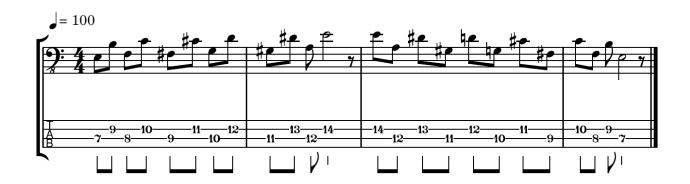


Bonus: Perfect 5th Chromatic Progression (Ascending and Descending)
